PUBLIC DUTY

Besides our parents, the fourth commandment obliges us to respect and obey our teachers and lawful superiors, both civil and ecclesiastical, when they discharge their official duties in conformity with the law of God. Laws for public safety must be obeyed, even such ordinary laws as a traffic light, a stop sign, and signs posting the speed limits. It involves far more than receiving a traffic fine. It is a matter of conscience and obeying God's law.

To disobey traffic laws is to endanger our lives as well as the lives of others. To obey the fourth commandment, we should keep the laws because we see God's will in them, not for fear of penalty or punishment. If the civil law obliges or allows citizens to violate the law of God, we must refuse to obey. An example of this would be the 1973 abortion decision which has been the cause of the death of several million innocent children.

Employers must be just to their workers and workers must be just to their employers. As loyal citizens of our country, we must respect civil authority and obey just laws. That is, we must conscientiously fulfill all civil duties. The principal civil duties are to pay taxes, to defend one's country, to fulfill one's duty of voting, to work and support laws which protect Christian morals and the common good.

I sincerely thank each one of you who worked at putting things together so that the celebration on May 29th was a success. I include in my gratitude those who took the time to come and be a part of our gathering. I have not mentioned any particular group as I don't want those not mentioned to feel excluded. I was a bit wound-up because I wanted the first communicants to have a very special day which I hope they had.

May God always enlighten us as we pray for each other.
