SPIRITUAL TRUTHS

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is one of the two Sacraments which heals and saves the baptized person from sin. The other Sacrament of healing is Confession. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is the continuation of the Lord's compassion for the Sick. Christ so identified with the sufferings of the Sick that He made their sufferings His own.

SPIRITUAL MATTERS

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick confers grace and this grace i) strengthens the sick person with the courage and peace to endure whatever sufferings are caused by disease or old age; ii) forgives all sins for which the sick person has true sorrow but was unable to confess; iii) sometimes restores health if it is appropriate for the salvation of the sick person; iv) and prepares the sick person for the transition to eternal life. Those who are in danger of death may receive this Sacrament. Those who receive the Anointing of the Sick and then recover may receive the Sacrament again if their illness worsens.

SPIRITUAL WISDOM

The essential rite of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is worded: "Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit" said by the priest while he anoints the forehead of the recipient. Then the priest says, "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up" while anointing the palms of the hands of the recipient. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is often preceded by the Sacrament of Confession, if the sick person's condition allows it, followed by the reception of Holy Communion. When Holy Communion is received following the Sacrament of Anointing, it is called Viaticum which literally means food for the traveller. Holy Communion is the seed of eternal life and is therefore appropriately given to those who are about to pass into eternal life. As soon as any of the faithful begins to be in danger of death, the fitting time for them to receive this Sacrament has certainly already arrived.
